<p>Sing the rhyme Incy Wincy spider.</p> <p>Can you sing the rhyme fast? Can you sing the rhyme slow?</p> <p>Song words provided.</p>	<p>Draw or colour some minibeasts and name them.</p> <p>Ladybird caterpillar bumble bee spider worm butterfly snail.</p> <p>Sheet provided if you would like to use it.</p>	<p>Make a model of a minibeast. You could use playdough, empty cardboard tubes, paper cups or paper and pens.</p> <p>You could make a butterfly, spider, ladybird, worm or caterpillar.</p>
<p>Go for a walk or look in the garden for some minibeasts. If you see a minibeast, tick it on your chart. I wonder how many minibeasts you will see in 1 week.</p> <p>Sheet provided if you would like to use it.</p>	<p>Clap out syllables of minibeasts names. Worm-(1 clap) Spi-der-(2 claps) Butt-er-fly (3 claps) Cat-er-pill-ar (4 claps)</p> <p>Can you clap the names of other minibeasts?</p>	<p>Let's move like a minibeast. Can you: Wiggle like a worm Fly like a butterfly Buzz around like a bee</p> <p>Can you think of other ways to move like minibeasts?</p>
<p>Roll a dice, spots or numbers. Give a ladybird the number of spots that match the number on the dice. You could use buttons, beads or bits of paper to create the spots.</p> <p>Sheet provided if you would like to use it.</p>	<p>Share a story with your grown up. A story about a minibeast would be good if you have one. Draw a picture about the story you shared together. Tell your grown up about the picture.</p> <p>Note for Adult: Write what your child says on their picture.</p>	<p>Use a piece of string or ribbon. Pretend it is your pet worm. Can you find things longer than your pet worm? Can you find things shorter than your pet worm?</p> <p>Sheet Provided if you would like to use it.</p>
<p>A butterfly has the same pattern on each of their wings. Can you create a butterfly with wings that are the same on both sides?</p> <p>Sheet provided if you would like to use it.</p>	<p>Grown up cut a circle shape of paper and if possible, put some small holes around the edge of the circle. Thread some string through the holes to create a spider web.</p>	<p>Watch Come Outside-Butterflies on You tube Auntie Mabel and Pippin will tell you all about caterpillars and how they become butterflies. Watch https://youtu.be/btFctMhF3il to hear the story about the Very Hungry Caterpillar.</p>
<p>Sing There's a tiny Caterpillar. This song helps us learn how a caterpillar turns into a butterfly.</p> <p>Song words Provided.</p>	<p>Tell a grown up which minibeast is your favourite. Tell them why it is your favourite minibeast? Ask other people in your family which minibeast is their favourite and why?</p>	<p>Look around the garden and see if you can find a spider web. Is the spider inside the web? Can you create a picture of the spider web?</p>
