<p><b>Play the Red Riding Hood board game</b> (Sheet available on school website)</p> <p>Who can get to Grandma's house first? Take it in turns to roll the dice and count carefully.</p>	<p><b>Write a shopping list for Grandma</b></p> <p>What do you need to buy at the shop?</p> <p>Say each word out loud and then sound it out slowly to hear each of the sounds. Try to write all the sounds in each word.</p>	<p><b>Make sandwiches for your picnic</b></p> <p>Practise using a knife to spread the butter and then add your favourite fillings.</p> <p>Why not set up an indoor picnic with your family?</p>
<p><b>Finger adding</b></p> <p>Play with a partner. Each person chooses an amount of fingers to hold up. You must add them together to find how many fingers there are altogether. Can you write it as a number sentence? EG- <math>2+4=6</math></p>	<p><b>CVC missing middle sound</b> (Sheet available on school website)</p> <p>Look at the picture, say the word and sound out each sound. What is the missing sound in each word? Write the missing sound in the space.</p>	<p><b>Make stick puppets</b> (Sheet available on school website)</p> <p>Cut out the characters from the story and retell the story of Little Red Riding Hood to your family.</p>
<p><b>Little Red Riding Hood Adding</b> (Sheet available on school website)</p> <p>Count how many items there are altogether and write the total.</p>	<p><b>Draw your favourite character from Little Red Riding Hood</b></p> <p>Label what they look like and write a sentence about them. Don't forget to use finger spaces and put a full stop at the end of your sentence.</p>	<p><b>Learn about Wesak</b></p> <p>Buddhists around the world will be celebrating Wesak this week. <p><b>Simple sums</b></p> <p>Can you use objects to help you solve these number sentences?</p> <p><math>3+4=</math> <math>7+2=</math> <math>6+3=</math></p> <p>Try writing your own number sentences to solve.</p>	<p><b>Phase word practise</b> (Sheet available on school website)</p> <p>Practise reading your phase words. You could stick them around the house or play snap with them. When you can read them all, try the next sheet. All the phase word sheets are available on the school website.</p>	<p><b>Sorting Materials</b></p> <p>How many different ways can you sort your toys?</p> <p>EG- hard and soft, plastic and wood, wheels and no wheels</p> <p>Try to think of your own ways of sorting toys.</p>
<p><b>Number hunt</b></p> <p>Go on a number hunt around your house.</p> <p>Which numbers can you spot?</p>	<p><b>Bug Club</b></p> <p>Use your Bug Club login to read some new books together. Remember to talk about what happens in the book and try to answer some questions about what you read.</p>	<p><b>Build an obstacle course</b></p> <p>Create an obstacle course around your home. You could use cushions as stepping stones, jump over books or crawl under chairs. How long does it take you to complete the course? Can you beat your time?</p>
