<p><b>Listen</b> to the story Brown bear, brown bear on You tube.</p> <p><a href="https://youtu.be/a_IRUmjJsa4">https://youtu.be/a_IRUmjJsa4</a></p> <p style="text-align: center;">Surprise!</p>	<p>Go on a rainbow colour treasure Hunt.</p> <p>Look around the house and garden and see if you can find objects that match the colours of the rainbow. Draw a picture of each of the things.</p> <p style="text-align: center;"><b>Sheet provided if you would like to use it.</b></p>	<p>Create a rainbow using paint, pens or pencils to remind people to stay safe. You could display your rainbow in the window if you have not already done this.</p> <div style="text-align: center;"></div> <p style="text-align: center;"><b>Sheet provided if you would like to use it.</b></p>
<p>Can you recall the animals from the story Brown bear, brown bear? What colour were the animals? Can you draw/colour the animals the correct colours.</p> <p style="text-align: center;"><b>Sheet provided if you would like to use it.</b></p>	<p>Practice writing numbers 0 to 10.</p> <p>If you practice writing the numbers using a different colour every day on the sheet, by the end of the week you will have rainbow numbers.</p> <p style="text-align: center;"><b>Sheet provided if you would like to use it.</b></p>	<p>Play a game called <b>Traffic lights</b>. Use a red, green and orange circle to start and then play just using the names of the colours. When you call or hold red circle they need to stop. Green go. Orange-sit down. Swap places too so child can have a turn of choosing the colours. Have fun!</p> <p style="text-align: center;"><b>Sheet provided if you would like to use it.</b></p>
<p>Choose 5 stones and 5 leaves from outside.</p> <p>Can you make a pattern? Pebble, leaf, pebble, leaf, pebble leaf.</p> <p>Can you do this with coloured beads, pegs, sweets. Lego, buttons or stones with coloured stickers on. Can you draw or take a photograph of your repeating pattern?</p> <p style="text-align: center;"><b>Only use 2 different things or colours to start.</b></p>	<p>If you have some paints/pens/pencils or crayons can you recreate a picture with them.</p> <p>What happens if you mix the colours red and yellow together Blue and yellow together Red and blue together Red, blue and yellow together.</p>	<p>Play I spy with my little eye I see something that is.....(colour name)</p> <p>See if a family member can guess what you can see that is the right colour.</p> <p>Swap over and you have a turn to guess what your family member can see.</p>
<p>In our Brown bear story, there was a sheep.</p> <p>Watch Come Outside-A Woolly Jumper and you will see how a sheep helps Auntie Mabel out.</p> <p><a href="https://youtu.be/41jx0Ljy23A">https://youtu.be/41jx0Ljy23A</a></p>	<p>Bears sleep in caves during the Winter.</p> <p>Do you think you could build a cave? Ask a grown up if you can use some chairs or a clothes airer and cover them with sheets and blankets to create your own little cave.</p> <p>Now you can pretend to be a bear. Pretend to sleep in your cave and when you are hungry go out to look for some food.</p>	<p>Use 5 different colour toys or household objects and put them in front of everybody.</p> <p>Everybody hides their eyes, and somebody takes an object away. Who can say what object and its colour is missing? Eg. Red ball is missing.</p>
<p>Choose a favourite bear who likes to play hide and seek. Somebody hides the bear and you must find him and tell people where he was hiding.</p> <p>Do not forget to use the words <b>in, on, under</b>.</p> <p>When you can use these words try using the words <b>in front of, behind and next to</b>.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Have fun!</p>	<p>Gather a collection of different coloured toys or household things and put them on the floor or table.</p> <p>Can you think of different ways of sorting the objects? Maybe by colour. Maybe by size. Maybe hard or soft.</p>	<p>What is your favourite colour? Tell somebody what it is and why it is your favourite colour.</p> <p>Ask other people what their favourite colour is and get them to tell you why it is their favourite colour.</p> <p>“My favourite colour is blue because it is the colour of the sea and I like to swim in the sea”.</p>
