Weekly Home Activities for Reception

Week Commencing: 11th May 2020 Book Focus: Little Red Hen

<p>Take away Use objects from around the house (EG pencils, fruit) to help you, solve these take away number sentences 5-2= 6-1= 7-3= Have a go at writing your own subtraction number sentences to solve</p>	<p>Act out the story of The Little Red Hen using stick puppets <i>(Sheet available on school website)</i> Cut out each of the characters and stick them to a lolly stick or a pencil. Use the puppets to help you tell the story.</p>	<p>Bake some bread rolls <i>(Sheet available on school website)</i> Read and follow the recipe to bake some of your own bread rolls. If you haven't got all the ingredients you can always use a bowl and spoon to pretend.</p>
<p>Farm subtraction <i>(Sheet available on school website)</i> Look at the subtraction number sentence. Cross off the amount you are taking away and find out how many are left? Write the answer in the circle.</p>	<p>Write a letter from the Little Red Hen <i>(Sheet available on school website)</i> Write a letter to one of the animals in the story and ask them to help you grow the seeds and make the bread. Remember to sound out carefully and use finger spaces!</p>	<p>Draw or paint Create a picture of one of the characters in The Little Red Hen. It could be the Little Red Hen, sleepy cat, lazy dog or noisy duck. Think about what colours you will use in your drawing/ painting. Can you mix the colours to make a new colour? <i>You can always make your own paint with water, food dye and a little flour to thicken the mixture.</i></p>
<p>Sing 'Ten green bottles' You could find 10 bottles to act out the song as you sing it. Can you write the number sentence for a part of the song? EG- 10-1=9 What if 2 bottles fell of the wall? How many would be left?</p>	<p>Think about the story How do you think the Little Red Hen felt when the other animals wouldn't help her? Why? Would you share the bread at the end if the other animals didn't help you?</p>	<p>Keep fit! Make up an exercise routine for the lazy dog in the story of The Little Red Hen to help him get fit and have lots of energy. Why is it important to exercise? How can we keep our bodies fit and healthy?</p>
<p>Bug Club Use your Bug Club login to read some new books together. Remember to talk about what happens in the book and try to answer some questions about what you read. <i>If you are having trouble logging in or need fresh books uploaded just send us an email.</i></p>	<p>CVC word sounding out <i>(Sheet available on school website)</i> Look at the pictures, say the word then sound out the word. Join the sounds to show how to write the word.</p>	<p>Food diary Keep a record of the food you eat throughout the week. How many fruits and vegetables do you eat each day? Do you eat the same foods each day or different foods? Which foods are healthy, and which are unhealthy?</p>
<p>Phase word practise <i>(Sheet available on school website)</i> Practise reading your phase words. You could stick them around the house or play snap with them. When you can read them all, try the next sheet.</p>	<p>Play phonics buried treasure <i>(Sheet available on school website)</i> Sound out the words on the coin. If it is a real word, put it in the treasure chest. If it is a made up, nonsense word, put it in the bin!</p>	<p>Regrow some vegetables <i>(Sheet available on school website)</i> Use the leftover parts of carrots, celery, spring onions or lettuce to grow new vegetables! Follow the instructions and see if you can regrow them!</p>

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
The Little Red Hen Bread Rolls Recipe Sheet

Ingredients

1kg white bread flour
2 sachets of dried yeast
2 tbsp vegetable oil
550-600ml water
Extra flour and oil for dusting
and brushing
Pinch of salt

Equipment

Large mixing bowl
Sieve
Tablespoon
Teaspoon
Wooden Spoon
Cling Film
Measuring jug
Scales
Pastry brush
Scissors
Baking tray
Wire rack



Method

1. Weigh the flour and sieve into the large bowl.
2. Add the salt and dried yeast, spoon in the oil, add the water.
3. Mix the oil and water into the flour with the wooden spoon until the dough is soft but not sticky. If it is too wet, add some more flour, if it is too dry add a bit more water.
4. Turn the dough onto a board or a clean work surface.
5. Knead by pulling and rolling the dough backwards and forwards.
6. Keep kneading for 8 to 10 minutes until the dough is smooth and springy.
7. Put back in the mixing bowl and cover with an oiled piece of cling film.
8. Leave the dough in a warm place for at least an hour until it has doubled in size and feels spongy. (The cling film allows you and the children to see what is happening!)
9. Tip the dough out on the board and knead for a minute or two.
10. Divide the dough into roll-sized portions and form into tight balls.
11. Bake for 12 to 15 minutes at 200°C.

Regrowing Vegetables

Science Experiment



Method

1. Carrot - Place the top cut-off end of a carrot in a shallow bowl of water. The green leaves will shoot from the top. Keep inside and place in a sunny spot.
2. Celery - Cut off the bottom 8cm of the stalk and place in a small bowl of water. After 3 or 4 days it will start to grow from the centre of the celery. Keep inside and place in a sunny spot.
3. Lettuce - Cut off the bottom of the head of lettuce and place it in a small bowl of water. It will start to regrow in around 3 days. Keep inside and place in a sunny spot.
4. Spring Onion - Use the white part of the onion, with any roots still intact. Place in a glass with water and it will start to grow. Keep inside and place in a sunny spot.


