<p>Listen to the story Mrs. Wishy Washy on You tube. https://youtu.be/yMcANea0BZA Wishy Washy!</p>	<p>You find some animals at the zoo or in the jungle and some animals at the farm. Can you cut out the pictures of the animals, name them and then sort them into farm animals and not farm animals.</p> <p>Sheet Provided</p>	<p>We practised the name of these baby animals 6 weeks ago, but can you remember them Duck pig sheep cow hen and horse.</p> <p>Sheet provided</p>
<p>Mrs. Wishy Washy had to wash the animals because they were very muddy. Can you find some things to clean just like Mrs. Wishy Washy? Do not forget to say wishy washy as you do your washing, just like Mrs. Wishy Washy.</p>	<p>Make some mud in a tray. Use a stick, straw or even your finger to write in it. What does the mud feel like? Can you: Write your name in the mud? Write some numbers in the mud? Draw the farm animals in the mud?</p>	<p>Draw or colour the characters from the story Mrs. Wishy washy. Add each of them to a stick or straw to make some puppets. Retell the story using your puppets.</p> <p>Sheet provided</p>
<p>Can you move like the animals in our story and make the right sound too? Cow duck pig What sound does a cow, duck and pig make? Can you move like other farm animals? Can other family members guess which animal you are being?</p>	<p>Count the farm objects and match the correct number to the objects.</p> <p>Sheets provided.</p>	<p>Order the number cards from number 1 to 15.</p> <p>Parents Practice numbers 1 to 5 first. Then 6 to 10. Then 11 to 15.</p> <p>If your child can do 1 to 5 fluently then try to 10 when they can do this fluently move to 15.</p> <p>Number sheet provided.</p>
<p>Use your pens, pencils or paints to create a picture of a farm. What animals are on your farm? Is there a farmer at your farm?</p>	<p>Create a picture with the handprints of your family.
