Book Focus: The Very Hungry Caterpillar

Please find some activities that you can do at home with your child, whilst the school is closed.

<p>Symmetrical butterfly (Sheet available on school website)</p> <p>Use the outline of a butterfly to show symmetry. Fold the paper in half and paint a design onto one side. Then fold it over to press the design onto the other side. Now you have a symmetrical butterfly!</p>	<p>Retell the story of The Very Hungry Caterpillar (Sheet available on school website)</p> <p>Cut out the stick puppets and stick pens or lolly sticks to them. Use the stick puppets to retell the story of The Hungry Caterpillar. Try to remember what happened at the beginning, middle and end.</p>	<p>Watch a short video https://youtu.be/3o_nE1X014U</p> <p>This video clip shows the lifecycle of a butterfly. What is the first stage of the butterfly's lifecycle? What happens after the caterpillar hatches?</p>
<p>Symmetry hunt</p> <p>Look around your house or garden to see if you can spot some symmetrical things. Remember symmetrical means it looks the same on both sides. Take a photo or write a list of symmetrical things you find.</p>	<p>Write a review (Sheet available on school website)</p> <p>Tell us what you thought about the story- The Very Hungry Caterpillar. You could use the leaf shaped paper to write a few sentences. Tell us about your favourite part, what you liked or didn't like about the story.</p>	<p>Lifecycle of a butterfly (Sheet available on school website)</p> <p>Cut out each picture and stick in in the correct place to show each stage in the lifecycle of a butterfly.</p>
<p>Ordering the days of the week (Sheet available on school website)</p> <p>Use the sequencing cards from The Very Hungry Caterpillar story to place the days of the week in order. Get an adult to ask you questions- What day comes after Thursday? What day is it today? What day will it be tomorrow?</p>	<p>Matching capital and lowercase letters (Sheet available on school website)</p> <p>Draw lines to match up each capital letter with its lowercase letter. We need to use a capital letter at the start of every sentence or when we write a name.</p>	<p>Lifecycle of a butterfly dance</p> <p>Make up movements and balances to represent the lifecycle of a butterfly. Try to use different levels and shapes and join each balance together with a movement. Put it all together and perform it for your family.</p>
<p>Weighing</p> <p>Hang a coat hanger on a door handle or hook. On each end of the hanger attach a small bag. Now you have your own set of scales! Place different fruit in each end to compare which is heavier and which is lighter. Which is the heaviest? Which is the lightest?</p>	<p>Phase word practise (Sheet available on school website)</p> <p>Practise reading your phase words. You could stick them around the house or play snap with them. When you can read them all, try the next sheet. All the phase word sheets are available on the school website.</p>	<p>Healthy foods sorting (Sheet available on school website)</p> <p>Cut out each of the foods and sort them under the correct headings- healthy, unhealthy or a mix of both. Why is it important to eat different foods?</p>
<p>Minibeast sorting (Sheet available on school website)</p> <p>Cut out the minibeasts and try sorting them in different ways. EG- leg/ no legs How many different ways can you sort them?</p>	<p>Bug Club</p> <p>Use your Bug Club login to read some new books together. Remember to talk about what happens in the book and try to answer some questions about what you read.</p>	<p>Design and make a butterfly</p> <p>Use recyclable materials to create your own butterfly. You could use pens, paints or collage to decorate you butterfly. Can you decorate it so it is symmetrical?</p>


Butterfly Life Cycle






