Message from the Headteacher





It has been great to see all the children back at school for the last four weeks. They have settled in really well, are working hard and enjoying their learning.

Much of the thanks for that goes to you, the wonderful parents and carers of James Cambell. The work you did with your children during the lockdown has helped to ensure that they continued to learn and were ready to return to school. I would also like to pay tribute to all the staff here for the excellent support they have provided to you and to the children in their home learning.

We all hope that there will not need to be another lockdown and schools will now remain open. However, we all need to continue to follow the guidelines – including social distancing, mask wearing and good hygiene (hands, face, space). I am very grateful to all of you for your support in this. Please try to distance as much as possible on the pavement outside the school gates – I know it's difficult, but we should do everything we can to avoid another surge of cases.

I would kindly ask you to do two things during the holidays to help keep everyone safe:

- if your child tests positive for coronavirus during the holidays and their symptoms started within 48 hours of last attending school, please email us on covidresults@jamescambellprimary.org.uk
- Arrange for your child to have a coronavirus test before returning to school on Monday 19th April. You will need to arrange this at least two days before school restarts to ensure that the result is back in time. You can book the test on the the government website

Votes for School

Every week the children from years 1 to 6 discuss a 'Votes for Schools' topic, which helps increase their knowledge and understanding of current affairs. As a parent, it would be great if you asked your child about the topic and discussed it with them at home.

This week's topic was 'Should the public decide which films win awards?' At the end of their discussion, the children get to vote on the topic – and to compare their vote to the views of children nationally.



Reception Admissions

Is your child due to start school in September 2021?

If your child was born between 1 September 2016 and 31 August 2017, they can start school in September, and you should have applied for their place by Friday 15 January.

If you missed this date, don't panic, there is still time and you can apply by visiting www.lbbd.gov.uk/school-admissions

It's important to know that getting your child a place at school is not an automatic process, so you still have to apply, even if they are already in the nursery or they have a brother or sister in the school.

Nursery Admissions

If your child was born between 1st September 2017 and August 31st 2018, you can apply for a nursery place at our school to start in September 2021.

Safer Internet Day

Keeping our children safe online is a priority for us at James Cambell so on February 9th we were excited to celebrate Safer Internet Day 2021, even though it had to be done from home.

This year's theme was: 'An internet we trust: Exploring reliability in the online world'. Each year group looked at different aspects of internet safety as well as the reliability and motives of content online. Nursery and Reception read a story about Smartie the Penguin. They learnt that if they are ever not sure about something, they should ask a trusted adult.

Year 1 became 'Fact Detectives' and learnt about checking the facts they find online with the help of 'Detective Digiduck'. Year 2 became 'Class Dojo influencers' and made videos to tell everyone how to stay safe online. They also made posters to spread the internet safety message.

Meanwhile, year 3 were internet detectives for the day and created posters to share what we should do to check what we read online is reliable and true; year 4 wrote their own paragraphs of 'fact or fake?' information.


In year 5, the children identified the motives behind different content, such as adverts and social media posts. They also learnt the definitions of some new words. Finally, year 6 discovered that things are not always as they appear and it is important to look at the bigger picture when deciding whether to trust something online.

We want you to continue to read at home during the Easter holidays. We are very pleased to announce that James Cambell Primary has been awarded a Music Mark accreditation. This award shows that the school is improving their musical delivery and opportunities for the children. It also allows the school to access many resources, which will enhance children's lessons.



Ramadan – a message for our Muslim families

It will soon be the holy month of Ramadan and we are aware that this is an extremely important time for our Muslim families. The holy month is due to commence from around 12th April 2021 (during the Easter holidays) until Eid al-Fitr, around 12th May 2021.

We understand that when children reach puberty they are expected to fast (children under the age of puberty are not expected to fast). However, we are also aware that children who fast may feel tired, find it difficult to concentrate and be at risk of dehydration.

To ensure that our children continue to learn to the best of their ability, the school requires that every pupil participate in the whole curriculum and therefore recommends that children in primary school do not fast on school days. We would suggest parents consider supporting their children, who have reached puberty, to fast at weekends and during the holiday.

However, if your child has reached puberty and you feel it is appropriate for them to fast on some school days during Ramadan, please complete the slip below and return it to your class teacher. Due to the school's duty of care, we ask that if your child is fasting that they go home for the lunch hour and then return to school for the afternoon lessons. We will also be asking your child to sit out of any PE and sporting events.

Children who fast will be monitored during their lessons and parents will be called if any child shows signs of being unwell. If parents cannot be contacted, you will obviously expect us to support the children in their well-being.

For families observing Ramadan may we wish you well in your challenge and Ramadan ul-Mubarak.


