Year 1 visit to St James's Park and Buckingham Palace – 28th April







On 28th April, all three year 1 classes ventured to central London to visit St James's Park as part of our science topic on plants. We found a variety of plants in the park and also did observational drawings of them.

As well as visiting St James' Park, we decided to take advantage of tourist sites within close proximity to enhance our children's wider experiences. Starting off with seeing Big Ben and the Houses of Parliament, we then walked down Whitehall past the Cenotaph and Downing Street. We then walked through Horse Guards Parade where we were lucky enough to witness the Changing of the Guards! After completing our science work and enjoying a picnic lunch in the park, we walked to Buckingham Palace before embarking back to James Cambell.

It is sometimes easy to forget just how lucky we are to be a tube ride away from Central London and the vast sights and experiences it has to offer- many of which are free! The children, and adults, had a fantastic day and it's safe to say that we all slept well that night. At James Cambell, we have been working hard on making playtimes more enjoyable for all our children, which is why we follow the OPAL (Outdoor Play and Learning) development programme.

Improved play and happier children leads to better learning. We therefore have outdoor play in all but the heaviest rain – please could you therefore make sure that your child comes to school with a coat or waterproof jacket every day.

Mental Awareness Week

Mental health Awareness Week took place **from 9**th **to 13**th **May** and the theme was loneliness. As a school we took 20 minutes a day to complete a circle time every day on the following themes:

Monday – What is mental health?

Tuesday - What is loneliness?

Wednesday – How can we help people who are feeling lonely?

Thursday - How can I show kindness and respect to help people around me feel good?

Friday – Looking forward - how can we look after our mental health every day?

We discussed various answers and decided that if we follow the school rules – be respectful, be safe and be ready - then we can help ensure that all children of our school are included in all activities. We also discussed the importance of continuing to talk about how we feel and knowing who our trusted adults are.

Year 5 & Year 6 participated in an interactive assembly involving aspects of Road Safety. 

Reception visit the park

Reception have been looking at the topic 'Growing'. Within this topic we have been looking at how we change as we grow, how animals change as they grow and also the process of how plants grow. During our topic the children have planted and cared for their own seeds and also had the opportunity to watch real caterpillars turn into butterflies in their own classroom.

To further the children's understanding of things that grow, the children took a trip to Parsloes Park where they found a range of plants and animals that are growing. The children became detectives and read a list of things that were growing in the park before conducting a hunt for them all. The children were fantastic at spotting all the things that were growing and changing in the park. They were then able to celebrate their success with a special playtime on the park equipment.
