

## Year 2 Update

In Year two this half term the children have had lots of hands on activities and lessons exploring habitats in Science, finding out where animals live and how they survive in a variety climates. The children explored the school's wild outdoor area and discovered a number of different insects such as slugs, worms, beetles, which they recorded in tally charts.

The classes also had the opportunity to visit Goresbrook Park and see what they might find there and discuss the differences and similarities. As part of the visit the children also drew maps for our geography topic which focuses on getting to know the local area. In pairs and groups the children talked about the human and physical features they could see in the park and around the surrounding area.

As October is also Black history month we have discussed important people of colour and celebrated them in different ways. In one PE lesson all three classes came together for an African dance. The children really enjoyed trying out new dance moves and listening to the African music as they danced as a year group

## Year 5 Valence House visit

Year 5 visited Valence House on 17th and 21st October 2022 to participate in Local History workshops. The children visited the museum and looked at old artefacts, analysing old newspaper clippings and participating in drama. The children were very excited about this opportunity to enhance and enrich their history topic.



Children gathered information about Dagenham in the past such as the Ford industry, the chemist and leisure time. We enjoyed looking at the model of Dagenham and the old streets that are still there today.



Children looked in the archives and learnt about James Cambell, a significant person from the local area, who our school is named after. They studied past documents to find out about people's lives in the past.



Through role play children found out that Chadwell Heath was built by the Romans.





## Show Racism the Red Card!

On Friday 21<sup>st</sup> October we are celebrating Wear Red Day. This is with the charity 'Show racism the red card.' In the afternoon, the children are having lessons around this theme. Year 5 and 6 will be looking at the consequences of hate; years 3 and 4 will be looking at the question what is an ally; and years 1 and 2 will be looking at the effects of a crumpled piece of paper. 


# James Cambell pupils receive thank you letter from the Queen
