## **Outdoor Play and Learning at James Cambell**



Since the pandemic, we at James Cambell have been working really hard to improve the play opportunities for all our children.

This helps will physical and mental wellbeing. We stagger lunches and make sure lunch times run efficiently so children have as much play as possible. We have invested heavily in two state of the art climbing frames and a superb, huge sandpit which the children love. Children at OPAL schools rapidly develop creativity, imagination, cooperation, resilience, social skills, emotional regulation, stamina, confidence and readiness to learn on returning to the classroom.

Play is a human need and a human right. Children and staff at OPAL's schools report feeling less stressed and happier, and more excited about school.



Our junior children can play across 3 play grounds and we have a sports coach on the playing field everyday organising things like badminton, tennis and field games.



In addition, we have dressing up clothes, a ball playground, a quiet lunchtime club, a scooter and skateboard zone, a quiet area for outdoor art and reading, and 600 tyres for den building. We also have mud kitchens which were kindly made by some Y4 parents. We also have an outdoor music area with pots and pans, as well as instruments donated by the Music Hub.

The children have a fantastic open ended playtime, where they can play with their siblings and children of all ages. It's a return to old fashioned play and our visitors comment on the joy and laughter in our playgrounds.



With outdoor play and learning, there is no such thing as bad weather- just bad clothing! So make sure your child has a hat with a hood. Of course, if it rains heavily or the weather is inclement, the children are brought in and play with our 'wet play' toys- then back out as soon as the weather is better.

Please let the Office know if you would like to get involved. We welcome any donations from businesses who can supply loose parts e.g. pipes, pallets or if you are skilled in obtaining funding too.

We are always looking for games, scooters, balls, hoops, tarpaulin etc.

We are now planning the next phase of our outdoor improvements, with work staring over

the summer holiday. This will include two major projects:

- a major revamp for the Reception courtyard, including a new timber tower (design below) and extended canopies to provide better shelter for the children; and
- New canopies for the Key Stage 2 playground to provide shade in sunny weather and shelter from light rain.

# Year 5 Wonderdome Planetarium Experience


