Young Peoples Safety Summit



Over the past few years, the Local Authority an has organised annual Young People's Safety Summit for Secondary Schools. This has served as incredibly valuable opportunity for key stakeholders to hear directly from young people about their experiences of safety and safeguarding in Barking and Dagenham, through schools, friendship groups and the community. Outcomes of the summits have directly informed the work of our Community Safety Partnership, and Safeguarding Children's Board.

James Cambell Primary pupils attended the first ever Safety Summit for upper Key Stage 2 pupils. This was a great opportunity to hear about the lived experience of our children.

We were proudly represented by **Zachary, Hazel, Hope and Hayden** who shared their experiences and insight into what it like living and attending school in LBBD. Their input will form part of the feedback that will keep all of our children and young people safe in the borough.

On 22nd June, Year 6 visited Valence House Museum to support their study of World War 2. When we arrived at the museum, we were split into groups and directed to our first activity. There were three activities in total, all of which were such great fun! One of them was the making of soup, bread, and coconut ice. Many people during the war were encouraged to grow their own fruit and vegetables to supplement their food allowance from rationing and help feed their families. Later in

the day, we were lucky enough to sample the end products. They were amazing!

A drama session allowed us to immerse ourselves into the lives of evacuees; we have so many talented actors and actresses in the making. For some children, it was difficult to get billeted, and their treatment in their new homes was quite dreadful. The third activity gave us the opportunity to be creative. We were able to design and paint a poster to help people stay safe, help the war effort by working in the factories, digging for victory and growing our own vegetables to mention but a few.

We learnt so much from our visit and were able to use the information in our work. We thoroughly recommend a visit over the summer. You'll love it!

Parent Survey Results

Your Views Matter!

Feedback from the Parent survey

Thank you so much to everyone who responded to the recent parent survey. It was great to have over 200 responses and to hear your views on the school.

Overall, you were very positive about the school:

- 97% of you said that your child felt happy at school
- 86% agreed that the school makes sure that their child is well-behaved
- 96% of you said that the school has high expectations for your child
- 97% agreed their child does well at school
- 94% thought that there were a good range of subjects available at the school
- 89% would recommend the school to another parent

The percentages reflect the improvements that the school is continuing to make.

Here are a few of your comments:

I love that my child loves going to James Cambell. I could not wish for a better school for him.

I like the playground – they have different activities for kids.

Teachers are available to talk to if there are any concerns every day and always find time to talk.

Teachers are friendly, approachable and responsive. They are constantly striving to improve and be better.

I like that if something is wrong they will deal with it quickly.

Every single teacher my son has had has gone above and beyond.

We like that children are encouraged to reach their goals.

Community-orientated.

Friendly and professional teachers and staff. High standard of teaching ability and knowledge. Discipline is firm but friendly. A happy atmosphere.

Staff are very friendly and try their best to find solutions. My child is happy here.

I love the new behaviour policy (ready, respectful, safe) and have even implemented some if it at home. Also OPAL is great.

The teachers are fantastic and kids are happy.

I love how the teachers are very supportive towards children.

However, we also know that we can do better. It was really helpful to have your suggestions on how we can improve the school even further.

We have set out some of your main points in the questions and answers below:

What are the plans for clubs next year?

We will continue to look for opportunities to expand the range of clubs that are available to our children. We already run a range of afterschool clubs next year and will be writing to you in September about what clubs will be available next year. There will be a small charge for these clubs to be able to cover our costs; however, they will be free if your child is eligible for Pupil Premium (please speak to the office if you think this might apply to you - we would be happy to help).

Can children have more homework?

It is always a difficult balance to set the right amount of homework. Our policy is to provide sufficient homework to support the child's essential learning in reading, writing and maths. We also aim to set homework that it is relatively easy for parents/carers to help with at home - for example reading, spellings and times tables. It really helps your child if you can support them with their homework and ensure that they always complete it.

We appreciate that some of you who would like us to set more homework. If this applies to you, then please speak to your class teacher about other activities and websites that you could use to support your child at home.

How does the school support children with SEND (special educational needs and disability)?

Every child matters and we work hard to meet the educational needs of all our pupils, working closely in partnership with parents to achieve this.

We therefore aim to provide a curriculum which is accessible to all our pupils, delivered through high quality teaching with staff who understand the individual needs of the pupils in their classes. However, we recognise that some pupils will encounter a greater challenge with learning, and these pupils will require additional support, strategies or materials to access the curriculum.

If you would like to find out more about how the school can support the individual needs of your child, then please arrange to speak with your class teacher or with the SENDCo, Hazel Thompson.

What is the school's view on parental behaviour at the school gate?

At James Cambell, we have high expectations of the behaviour of everyone within the school community - children, staff and parents/carers. We would strongly encourage everyone to model respectful behaviour towards each other and avoid using bad language. We are grateful to the overwhelming majority of parents/carers who already act as excellent role models for the children.

Unfortunately, there have been rare occasions of appropriate language or behaviour and this will not be tolerated. If the school becomes aware of a parent/carer using bad language or displaying inappropriate behaviour, then we will issue them with a letter setting out our expectations and warning them that they could potentially be barred from entering the school's premises.

Please feel free to speak to us about any inappropriate behaviour that you witness and we will seek to address it.

What is the school's approach to managing behaviour?

At James Cambell, we follow a restorative approach to behaviour management which encourages children to take responsibility and to consider the harm caused after a negative incident, rather than the punishment. We strongly believe that this approach is the best way to achieve a positive partnership between adults and children based on trust, respect and an ethos of mutual care and consideration.
