All day nursery children will need to bring a packed lunch. Lunchtime 11:30—12:30.

Important Information.

Having a child in our nursery does not mean you will automatically receive a full-time place for your child in Reception for September 2024. You will need to apply for a school place online. Further information will be provided to you once your child has started nursery.



What will I do there?

Foundation Stage Curriculum.

There are 7 areas of learning within the curriculum.

Prime Area 1: Personal and Social Development

Children learn about themselves and others. They are encouraged to be independent and to try out new activities. They learn to express their feelings and encouraged to behave respectfully. They learn about sharing and the importance of co-operating with others.

Prime Area 2: Physical Development.

In both, the indoor and outdoor area, children are encouraged to be active and to improve the skills of coordination, control and movement.

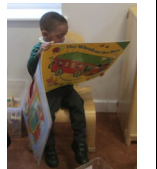


Prime Area 3: Communication and Language.

Children to take part in daily activities which are designed to develop their speaking and listening skills.

Specific Area 1: Literacy.

Children are encouraged to link sounds and letters and to begin to read and write. Children are given access to a wide range of reading materials to ignite their interest.



Specific Area 2: Mathematics.

Children count, sing number rhymes and play number games. They find out and talk about shapes, patterns develop their vocabulary to describe size, time, money, length and weight.

Specific Area 3: Understanding the World.

Children find out about their environment. They are encouraged to investigate, observe and ask questions. Children have the opportunity to celebrate festivals and learn about their own and other people's cultures.



Specific Area 4. Expressive Arts and Design.

Children are encouraged to express their thoughts, ideas and feelings through art, music, movement and role play.
